THOMAS RICCIO (RICCIO), Date of Birth [REDACTED], residing at [REDACTED] Los Angeles, California, telephone number [REDACTED], was interviewed at 601 South Figueroa, Suite 3900, Los Angeles, California, zip code 90017. After being advised of the identity of the interviewing agents, RICCIO voluntarily provided the following information:

RICCIO and O.J. SIMPSON (SIMPSON) wanted to conduct a planned operation to generate media attention about SIMPSON's stolen items. RICCIO explained that SIMPSON felt that this was another way in which he continued to be victimized. RICCIO was not clear on how the operation would be staged or publicized. SIMPSON wanted RICCIO's assistance in setting up the operation and helping obtain interviews for SIMPSON through various media outlets after the fact.

The interviewing agents advised RICCIO that there were many potential issues concerning the information provided, including whether or not the items were actually stolen from SIMPSON; and that, before pursuing this matter in any fashion, RICCIO should contact an attorney to determine the legality of any course of action he (RICCIO) was considering pursuing. RICCIO was directed to consult an attorney several times during the course of the interview. RICCIO advised that he could call SIMPSON during the interview. RICCIO told the interviewing agents that he just wanted the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) to know about the situation. RICCIO was admonished that he would not be absolved of any potential criminal liability in connection with this matter because of having provided the information on this date.

The factual information provided by RICCIO was initially documented via FD-71. The information contained herein, determined to have potential relevance in light of recent events, is being provided to augment and supplement the information previously provided.
